Pirate broadcasts undermine public health & safety

- **Pirate signals disrupt Emergency Alert Systems** (EAS) and other services used by first responders that are essential to public safety
 - O EAS alerts save lives by delivering critical updates to residents and families on local & national emergencies such as tornados, hurricanes, flash floods or missing children alerts
- Pirates often transmit high-powered signals in densely populated areas, exposing nearby residents and families to radiation levels above the federal safety standard
 - o A **pirate broadcaster in Clifton, New Jersey operated at 2,573.3 watts**, exposing anyone within 68 feet of the transmitting antenna to radiation levels above the MPE standard
 - o **In the Bronx, a pirate station was operating at 288.4 watts**, exposing anyone within 22.76 feet of the transmitting antenna to radiation levels above the MPE standard
- Transmissions can include abusive, bigoted, misogynistic language and criminal organizing
 - The Orange County Gang Unit in Miami, FL arrested an illegal pirate operator in 2010 for allegedly broadcasting criminal activity including where to buy drugs & find sex workers

They interfere with air traffic & first responder systems

- Interference from pirate stations also cause **errors in navigational guidance**, disrupt pilot to ground communications and other aeronautical systems
- 100 illegal pirate stations operate just in the New York City area, and their numbers are rising

Congress Can Do Better!

Penalties for pirate radio interference should be at least as serious as the threat it poses

H.R. 538: The PIRATE Act

- Preventing Illegal Radio Abuse Through Enforcement (PIRATE)
- Increases fines for pirate radio broadcasting violations to no more than \$2 million
- Imposes fines up to \$100,000 per day for pirating violations, subject to the same \$2 million limit
- Endorsed by:
 - National Association for Broadcasters (NAB)
 - New York State Broadcasters Association (NYSBA)
 - National Association of Black Owned Broadcasters, Inc. (NABOB)
