



KNOW YOUR RIGHTS!

- You have the right to remain silent and contact an attorney.
- You have the right to due process and to have your case heard before a judge.

IF YOU INTERACT WITH LAW ENFORCEMENT OR ICE:

- You do not have to reveal your immigration status.
- Do not open the door.
- Ask to see a search warrant, which must be signed by a judge and have your name.
- You can refuse permission to enter your home if agents do not have a valid warrant.
- If ICE enters without a valid warrant, ask for the agents' names and badge numbers.

IF YOU ARE ARRESTED OR DETAINED:

- You have the right to speak to a lawyer immediately.
- Do not sign any document you do not understand.
- You have the right to remain silent - anything you tell an officer can be used against you in immigration court.
- If you fear prosecution or torture in your home country, tell an officer and contact a lawyer.
