The COVID crisis has hit families hard

- An estimated **<u>8 million Americans fell into poverty</u>** in 2020 because of the pandemic
- Many parents had to give up some or all of their earned income to stay at home with their kids
- Millions of families are experiencing hunger for the first time, with an estimated <u>17 million</u> <u>children</u>—many cut off from free school lunches—**without enough to eat**

Child Tax Credit offers families a lifeline

- The Democratic majority in Congress responded to the COVID crisis with significant improvements to the 1997 Child Tax Credit, advanced as part of the American Rescue Plan including:
 - Increased benefits up to **\$3,000** per qualifying child ages 6-17 and **\$3,600** per qualifying child younger than six
 - Expanded the lifeline to include 17-year-old children
 - Delivered child tax credit payments faster with up to \$300/month going to millions of eligible families throughout the second half of 2021.
- This benefit provides children and their families with additional monthly payments throughout the year, helping them cover the costs of food, childcare, diapers, healthcare, clothing, and taxes
- The **Child Tax Credit will help 39 million households and an estimated 65 million children**—that's 88% of children in America!

'Cash for Kids' lifts up our communities!

Because of the expanded and improved Child Tax Credit:

- A stunning 82.3% of children living in Capital Region will benefit from the Child Tax Credit that's 121,00 children
- The average benefit for **37,100 households** is \$2,600
- The expanded and improved Child Tax Credit lifts 5,200 Capital Region kids out of poverty
 1,500 children in the region will be lifted out of deep poverty
- Families with children in poverty will receive \$4,800 on average
