### Horseracing is a Major Economic Driver

- The horse racing industry generates some **\$26.1 billion in direct economic impact**
- More than **146,000 U.S. jobs** are created from direct spending in the horse industry
- Many states benefit from the horseracing industry in the form of economic and job development
  - In New York, horse racing contributes more than **\$5 billion annually**
  - In Maryland, some **20,000 jobs** are sustained by the horse racing industry

### Lack of Regulation & Uniformity Hurts the Sport

- There are 38 unique state racing commissions, each with different rules and regulations
- Roughly half of all Thoroughbred starts in the U.S. are from horses that compete in more than one state and nearly eighty percent of wagers are across state lines
- Nearly every country except for the U.S. has banned race-day medication, limiting the ability of American breeders, trainers and horses to compete abroad

## **Congress Needs to Stop Horsing Around!**

The **Horseracing Integrity and Safety Act** would establish a uniform national medication and racetrack safety program, encouraging fair competition, modernizing regulations across state lines and prioritizing the safety and welfare of the people and equine athletes involved in the noble sport of kings.

#### The Horseracing Integrity and Safety Act

- **1.** Recognizes a conflict-free, self-regulatory organization responsible for creating and implementing an anti-doping program for the entire horseracing industry
- **2.** Develops standardized list of permitted and prohibited substances, treatments and methods for all covered races in the United States
- 3. Requires full & fair information disclosure to breeding stock purchasers and the wagering public
- 4. Takes other steps providing for the increased safety and welfare of horses, jockeys and drivers
