America is facing a gun violence epidemic

- More than 36,000 Americans die every year from gun violence
 - o 100 lives lost every day
 - o Increased **16%** from 2014-2017
- We are 29x more likely to die of a gun homicide than the people of any other developed nation
- Not explained by video games or mental illness
- The only major factor that distinguishes the U.S. from our peers is the number of guns

We can take action to stop it

- Despite years of gun industry lobbying to stop scientific research into gun violence, there is ample evidence that gun safety laws save lives
 - o Research shows "safe storage" laws that prevent children from accessing guns save lives
 - o Strong background checks & red flag laws are already saving lives in states that have them

Congress Needs to Do its Job!

The House of Representatives has passed <u>H.R. 8: Bipartisan Background Checks Act</u>. In addition, Congressman Tonko also cosponsors other common-sense gun safety legislation including:

- The Disarm Hate Act: prohibits individuals convicted of a misdemeanor-level hate crime or who have received an enhanced sentence for a misdemeanor crime after a judicial finding that they acted with hate or bias motivation from buying or possessing guns
- **The COOL OFF Act:** requires all buyers to wait three business days before receiving a handgun, regardless of how quickly they pass a background check
- <u>The Assault Weapons Ban</u>: prohibits sale, transfer, production, importation of semi-automatic rifles, shotguns and pistols that have military-style features including large magazine sizes
- <u>The Extreme Risk Protection Order Act</u>: sets up a grant program to incentivize states to adopt extreme risk (a.k.a. red flag) laws that allow for courts to direct the temporary removal of firearms from a person at risk of harming themselves or others
- The Zero Tolerance for Domestic Abusers Act: protects survivors of dating violence & stalking by closing two loopholes in existing law and maintaining due process protections for the accused
